# Catherine's Cupboard

CATHERINE'S CUPBOARD has been serving our community for the past 20+ years, it's open the 1st & 3rd Tuesday each month from 5 till 7 (or until all are served). We serve anyone who comes, asking only for ID, if they have any. As members of SOUTHERN TIER FOOD BANK, we purchase at wholesale (or less), providing basic dry or canned goods, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy, and frozen meats. We try to provide 5 days of meals and include personal care items also. We operate on 100% donations or grants. Our location at the parish center means we have most overhead costs covered. However, we serve over 1200 people, requiring a budget of close to \$50,000 a year. PLEASE tell anyone you know who is feeling food insecure to stop in. If you would like to donate food items, they can be left at parish center or food barrel in church foyer. Monetary donations can be mailed to our parish office or via the online giving tab at stfrancisbing.org

#### Victim's Trust Fund

Some suggestions from our recent Synodal listening In March a settlement was reached between the Catholic Family of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Syracuse and portunities and build a stronger community spirit. Our the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors (aka-the survivors of sexual abuse) in the amount of \$100 million dollars. At that time, information was shared with the parish regarding St. Francis's contribution to the Victim's Trust Fund. Our contribution was based on our unrestricted assets as of the end of fiscal year 2023 (June 30, 2023) and that contribution was found to be \$309,485 due on June 1st, 2024.

During a meeting with the Finance Committee on May 14th (attendees: Father Tim Taugher, BethAnn Brooks, Bev Krinik, Pat Doyle & Joe Carpenter) it was decided that we would use the proceeds from the sale of the school in February 2023, which totaled \$270,224 and \$39,261 from our unrestricted funds to cover our contribution.

By making this contribution, the diocese, parishes, and other Catholic entities are relieved of their liabilities related to claims filed and are protected if another legislative window is opened from any claims of abuse that may have occurred up to June 19, 2020.

As a catholic family it is our moral obligation to provide reparation and share a role in bringing healing and reconciliation to the survivors. "if one part of the body suffers, all parts suffer with it..." We will continue to hold the victims in our thoughts and prayers.

# 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time: **Justice Challenge**

This week we celebrate the feast day of St. Anthony of Padua. We usually associate St. Anthony with prayers for intercession when we have lost something. But St. Anthony was also a compelling preacher. And his message was often against greed and for charity towards the poor. That earned him the title of "Friend of the Poor." Your challenge this week is to be a friend of the poor in your community. What can you do—individually, as a family, as a group of friends—to help someone in poverty? Choose a corporal work of mercy and respond by feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, or sheltering the homeless!

# 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time: **Creation Care Tip**

As we move into the summer months, let us think about how we use water. The World Health Organization reports, "Water scarcity impacts 40% of the world's population, and as many as 700 million people are at risk of being displaced as a result of drought by 2030." This week, look into ways of cutting your water usage. Reduce outside watering (drip irrigation can help a lot) and do so in mornings or evenings, when less water will evaporate. Turn off the faucet while brushing your teeth. Switch to a low-flow shower head or toilet and use faucet aerators. Monitor your water usage on your bill and seek out options for free water audits.
