#### Catherine's Cupboard

CATHERINE'S CUPBOARD has been serving our community for the past 20+ years, it's open the 1st & 3rd Tuesday each month from 5 till 7 (or until all are served). We serve anyone who comes, asking only for ID, if they have any. As members of SOUTHERN TIER FOOD BANK, we purchase at wholesale (or less), providing basic dry or canned goods, fresh fruit and vegetables, dairy, and frozen meats. We try to provide 5 days of meals and include personal care items also. We operate on 100% donations or grants. Our location at the parish center means we have most overhead costs covered. However, we serve over 1200 people, requiring a budget of close to \$50,000 a year. PLEASE tell anyone you know who is feeling food insecure to stop in. If you would like to donate food items, they can be left at parish center or food barrel in church foyer. Monetary donations can be mailed to our parish office or via the online giving tab at stfrancisbing.org

Heating & Cooling System Meeting

There will be a meeting on July 16, 2024, at 6:30 PM in the Parish Hall. We will be presenting information on a new heating & cooling system for the Parish Center. The current gas boiler in the parish Center is in its 65 year and, like or not, will fail sooner rather than later. Unlike what happened with the boiler in the school a few years ago, this time we can be proactive before we have a critical problem. As we mentioned, the purpose of our meeting on the 16th will be to provide information to the parish community about the different aspects of this project. We have approached this as opportunity to not only provide effective heating and cooling in the Parish Center, but also to reduce the carbon footprint at St. Francis (use less fossil fuel). The encyclical from Pope Francis, Laudato Si, which describes the importance caring for our home here on earth has been the incentive for this dual approach. Our Creation Care Team has been closely involved since the outset of this project. It has been largely through the efforts of some of those team members that we have been able to have a detailed energy audit here at the parish and gain access to some incentive funding. The project has proven to be a very interesting one and after our listening sessions in late April and early May, we thought this meeting would be a good opportunity continue our move toward Synodality at St. Francis. Please plan to attend. and it shouldn't be more than an hour or so.

July 14th is the feast day of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha, the patron of the environment and ecology. She led a very prayerful life devoted to the Eucharist and to serving others. Some in her tribe ridiculed her and she endured great suffering for her faith. Yet she never wavered in her beliefs. #### 15th Sunday in Ordinary: Creation Care Tip

In today's Gospel, Jesus commands his disciples to live simply as they spread the Good News. Just like the first disciples, we are asked to live simply too. This week, challenge yourself to live with fewer disposable items, cut down on your waste, and choose reusable items. Instead of using plastic wrap, use beeswax wraps or other reusable substitutes. Use cloth grocery bags and mesh vegetable bags instead of the single use plastic ones at the store. If you haven't already, commit to using a reusable coffee cup and metal straws.
